Update on School Uniform and PE days

During the Covid pandemic, it was necessary to change our policy on PE lessons and ask children to come to school in their PE kit on days when they are having PE. As the school is no longer operating under Covid restrictions, the governing body have decided that, from <u>Wednesday 3rd January 2024</u>, children will be expected to come to school in their school uniform every day and have their PE kit in a bag in school.

A number of standards in our school uniform have lapsed during this time and a full return to the agreed school uniform will be in place from <u>Wednesday 3rd</u> <u>January 2024.</u> This will involve all children being expected to wear black trousers or skirts instead of track suit bottoms. Anyone wearing track suit bottoms as part of their uniform (outside of PE lessons) will be asked to change into spare uniform for the day. Our policy on footwear will also be fully reinstated. A wide variety of brightly coloured trainers have crept into uniforms and, from Wednesday 3rd January, we will be insisting that children wear either black trainers, black shoes or dark coloured walking shoes (no bright colours).

White trainers and other coloured trainers will not be acceptable school uniform and any child wearing them for school will be given alternative footwear for the day. We are informing parents of our intention to return to pre-pandemic uniform standards well in advance to give people plenty of time to ensure that their child's uniform is correct. If anyone has concerns or worries about the cost of school uniform, please do not hesitate to speak to a member of staff. We have lots of spare uniform that we can give you. When our children are out and about at trips and events in our local area and further afield, we want the uniform that our children are wearing to reflect the high standards that we have in school.
