Reporting a child absent

We are still receiving messages on Class Dojo about children who are absent. <u>ALL pupil absence should be reported by telephone call to the school office by 9:00am</u>. Please leave a message on the school answerphone if no-one is able to take your call. Your message will be listened to and recorded on the register.

Parents who have not telephoned school to report their child's absence will initially receive a text message reminder to call school, then a telephone call from a member of staff and in some cases, where the school is unable to contact you, a home visit to carry out a welfare check.

Checking on messages regarding absent pupils is a key part of our daily safeguarding procedures.









Our Rewards System

The staff team have recently reviewed the school's behaviour policy and, as part of that, we decided to update our whole school reward systems. We will continue to give out a certificate to a standout child every week but will now call this our 'Star of the Week'. Each 'Star of the Week' has their name and the reason for their nomination read out by their class teacher in our Friday Reward Assembly. They are awarded a certificate along with a 'Star of the Week' lanyard to wear in school for the week. Individual teachers can then give special privileges to their 'Star of the Week', such as being the line leader for the week or the register monitor. These differ according to the age range of the class as, understandably, children grow out of things and a privilege to someone in the Early Years class may seem unimportant to a more mature member of Key Stage 2.

Along with our 'Stars of the Week' we also announce who the Class Dojo Champion is for the week. You will have noticed that teachers have added new Dojos onto the platform. In doing this we hope that it will be more obvious to children and their parents what the Dojo points have been awarded for. The weekly Dojo champions get to choose an item from our Dojo prize box or choose a voucher. We currently have vouchers which entitle the champion to come to school in non-uniform for one day and vouchers to skip the lunch queue for one day. We are hoping that the School Council will be able to suggest some extra vouchers that we can add to the prize box!
